



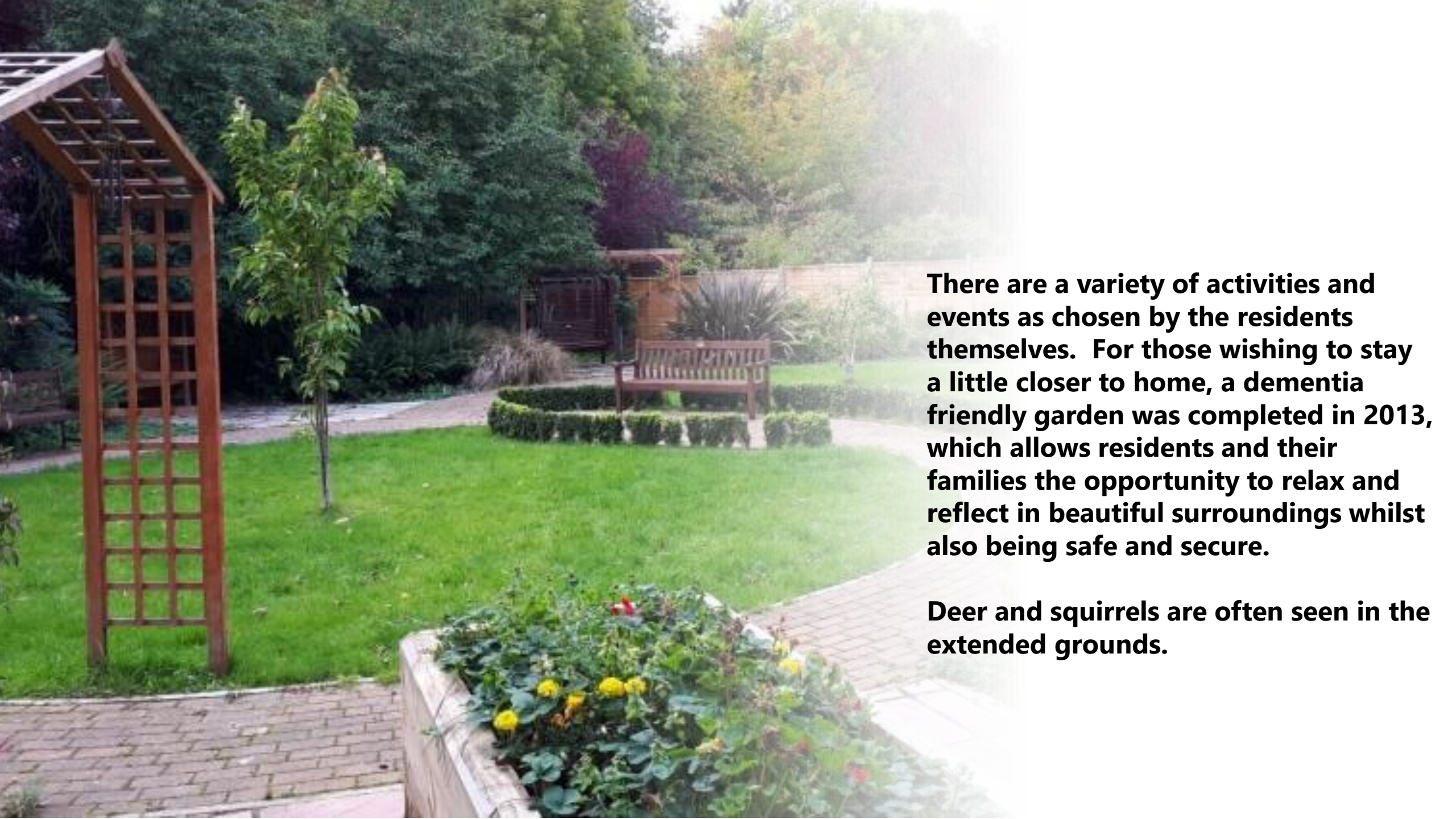
Welcome to Robin Hood House!

Robin Hood House is situated in Little Gaddesden, a small village within the 5000- acre Ashridge Estate, just 7 miles from Tring.

An area of outstanding natural beauty and a conservation area protected by the National Trust, Robin Hood House dates back to the 16th century and was once owned by the 3rd Duke of Bridgewater, famous for building the Bridgewater canal in the North-East of England.



There are a variety of activities and events as chosen by the residents themselves. For those wishing to stay a little closer to home, a dementia friendly garden was completed in 2013, which allows residents and their families the opportunity to relax and reflect in beautiful surroundings whilst also being safe and secure.

Deer and squirrels are often seen in the extended grounds.

This home is a residential care home providing a home to 22 residents aged 65 and over and offers specialist care for people living with dementia.

The house is characterful and full of individual charm.





The staff are all from the local area and deliver care in this warm, friendly setting and the local community.

The manager has coached and mentored the team and together they provide true person-centred care with empathy, understanding and respect.



There are easily identifiable signs around the home assisting service users to find their way around easily.

The home affords a large lounge, a small lounge/diner and an additional dining room.

Activities are held daily in the larger lounge, residents own rooms and garden.
